
## Philadelphia Flyers 2019-20 Season Preview



## PHILADELPHIA FLYERS: TEAM LOOK-AHEAD

With new head coach **Alain Vigneault** behind the bench, the Flyers enter the 2019-20 season looking to clinch a berth in the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the second time in three seasons and advance past the opening round for the first time since 2012.

# **SEASON-OPENING STATS**

\* The Flyers have won each of their last three season-opening contests, outscoring opponents 14-7 including a 5-2 defeat of the Golden Knights to start 2018-19. They trail only the Lightning and Canucks for the longest active streak of season-opening victories (both 5-0-0).

# **OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK**

- \* Fresh off his fourth season with at least 85 points, **Claude Giroux** (236-526—762 in 820 GP) sits 38 points shy of becoming the fourth player to record at least <u>800 points with the franchise</u>.
- \* Jakub Voracek (195-444—639 in 846 GP), who looks for a seventh 20-goal season, can become the second member of the 2007 NHL Draft class to collect at least 700 career points Patrick Kane (356-582—938 in 903 GP) is the only one to hit the mark, while Jamie Benn (281-368—649 in 745 GP) sits just ahead of him.
- \* Sean Couturier can join Jeff Carter (3; 2008-09—2010-11), John LeClair (5; 1995-96—1999-00) and Eric Lindros (4; 1995-96—1998-99) as just the fourth Flyers player in the last 25 years to record three straight 30-goal seasons.
- \* **Shayne Gostisbehere** (46-141—187 in 298 GP) sits 13 points shy of reaching the 200-point milestone in his NHL career. Only one defenseman has debuted with the Flyers and reached the mark in 350 games or fewer: **Behn Wilson** (313 GP).

THE FUTURE IS NOW

\* The Flyers selected **Joel Farabee** with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NHL Draft. He collected 17-19—36 in 37 GP with Boston University in 2018-19 en route to being named the NCAA (Hockey East) Rookie of the Year as well as the NCAA's Top Collegiate Rookie. Farabee will celebrate his 20th birthday on Feb. 25.

#### **BETWEEN THE PIPES**

\* Carter Hart, 21, strung together wins in eight consecutive appearances from Jan. 14 – Feb. 9, 2019 en route to a 16-13-1 record in his rookie season (31 GP). He can become the second active goaltender to record 30 or more career regular-season wins before turning 22, in which he would join Carey Price (47).
